We had a constant responsibility of wellbeing of 335 special friends and 250+ staff members. Mind you, the pandemic is still not over and we are fully geared up for the challenge.

I feel proud to share with you the tremendous efforts that ADHAR team has put in during this period of uncertainty. They raised to the occasion and accepted the challenge of fighting with COVID-19. We took a target to fight it out against all odds and keep our special ones safe and healthy at ADHAR. With whatever limited knowledge around

and with great help from our doctors, we decided on a particular protocol and SOP to be followed for safety of our special children which was strictly followed and it was reviewed periodically to align with situation around. We followed the practices like isolation of whole campus by restricting entries to outsiders, monitoring parameters like temperature & oxygen concentration twice day for both residents as well as staff members. We mandatorily used masks, sanitizers and followed proper distancing to restrict the spread of infection. Our medical team followed strict protocol on health issues of administrating medicines and further investigations when required.

I am thankful to each and every person who cooperated during this time. Our doctors, supervisory staff, house masters, care takers, teachers and other support staff did everything possible to take good care of our children. Cooperation from parents and our special children also cannot be ignored and it greatly supplemented our efforts. In a nutshell. I would like state that this

stupendous work can be termed as the most important milestone in the history of ADHAR. Today as I write to you, we have completed 100% vaccination of all our special ones & staff at Nashik and 73% vaccination at Badlapur.

However, we all should realize the huge change this pandemic has brought in our lives. It has altogether changed the way the world is going to function in future especially in next 2-3 years. It will take a lot of time to come back to normalcy. Additionally, this pandemic has put huge burden on financials of ADHAR and we need even more of wholehearted support from our parents and donors. As we prepare for these future challenges, we are getting equipped to adapt to changing dynamics of world order and bringing in the required changes within ADHAR to face them.

son of our founder chairman Late Mr. M. G. Gore and also my nephew.



- To provide basic facilities like hygienic food, laundry, clean & self-sufficient residential facility, Telephone & internet access, TV, newspaper, recreations & games, yoga and other activities.
- To take care of their physical health with proper medicinal facilities,

- To provide proper lifestyle & socialization through group activities, picnics, library, organize motivational talks on different topics, meditation, yoga classes etc.
- To support them to administer their personal chores like purchases, banking etc.

Free COVID-19 Vaccination Camp

Since dealing with intellectual disability, where special child themselves never know that they are disabled, it's a quite challenging to care these special ones during COVID-19 pandemic. We tried to vaccinate these special ones as well as care taking staff also. We could easily managed with some special children as they were less dependent and follow our instructions too.

But the actual challenge was to vaccinate our bedridden and

wheel-chair bound residents. Mr. Ajay Mehta - Trustee ADHAR and his team of MeHin successfully conducted free vaccination camp at ADHAR Badlapur on 30th June, 2021. We vaccinated total 121 beneficiaries including special children, care taking staff and their family members also. Just because of visionary initiative of Trustee Mr. Ajay Mehta, today at ADHAR Badlapur we have completed 99% for 1st Dose and 45% for 2nd Dose.



COVID-19 Update Nashik Unit



For the last one and a half years, Adhar Nashik has been facing unprecedented challenges like the rest of the world. Fighting these challenges has taught us a great deal. We now know that we have to be more careful and vigilant while working with our special children in Adhar. With the strong support of our medical team and our Chairman Shri. Vishwas Gore, we have been able to take good care of all our special children and our staff and will continue to do so.

At the start of the pandemic, we took a decision to establish a Covid Executive Committee to take good care of the children. The Committee consists of our staff (from 9 different villages) and our doctor. The Committee shares with us an overview of the developing situation around us. The Committee helped to lay down key measures against Covid and advised the necessary instructions to our caring staff and checked their implementation as well.

We noticed that it was difficult for children to wash/ sanitize their hands regularly and to maintain proper distance between each other. So it was essential that the staff coming to work should observe hand hygiene and masking strictly. As our Home is in the village and our staff comes from rural areas, so we first created awareness in the minds of the staff so that they can take care of themselves and our special children.

At the start of the pandemic, we requested the parents and relatives of the children to not come to the center. Villagers coming from the nearby villages were identified and only those people were allowed to come whose villages were COVID free. Wherever the villages had higher spread of COVID, those were asked to stay home and be safe. The management continued paying their salaries to such employees and also extended financial support, preventive medicines and counselling support.

As per the advice given by the doctor, we instituted steps like: Checking temperature and oxygen saturation for all employees, sanitizing their hands at entrance, monitoring children for fever and oxygen saturation at all times. Children suspected of infection, were quarantined, treatment given and

monitored till their symptoms were cured. We also regularly sanitize the entire premises and started preventive medications for the children. We made it a habit for the staff to do regular sanitization and wear masks.

When the government started the vaccination campaign in March 2021, we ensured that all our children and staff members were given the first dose.

We also organized a vaccination camp in Adhar with the help of MLA Mr. Manikrao Kokate and village Sarpanch Mr. Bhagwan Wakchaure. However, not all the children could be vaccinated as the new government rules do not allow them to take the second dose till 84 days have elapsed. In the vaccination camp, only 11 children could take the second dose of vaccine. As the vaccines were not freely available the task of providing our children and staff with the second dose was proving to be challenging.

One of our employees, Mr. Nivruti Memane -Driver's acquaintance Mr. Tukaram Varghade extended a helping hand, he introduced us Dr. Vede. He is a doctor and a government officer who helped us in this difficult situation and started working from that very day itself. With the doctor's help, a Asha Tai came to our Adhar campus and administered the second vaccine dose to our special children.

The same challenges arose for our staff as well - they had taken the first dose of Covaxin but the second dose was not available. This time, with the help of our staff member, Mr. Yogesh Wakchaure (Nurse), we got all our staff vaccinated. All our special children and staff have been vaccinated by June 2021.

Covid not only taught Adhar how to take care of itself, its staff, and its special children. It proved that our bonds with our workers and the surrounding villages is strong. We all worked together as a team to defeat the pandemic.

Menopause and Management

Menopause and management program presented by Ms. Rupal Ajmera, Mental health professional. Program Period From – 5th May to 7th June (weekly) & Timing - 1.30 – 2.30pm (Batch wise).

Background/Objective of Training program: The human brain is a complex and well-designed machine, but it requires regular maintenance!

We can reduce symptoms of stress, anxiety and depression and improve our physical health, immune systems, enhance our self-esteem and our relationship with others by prioritizing our self care.

Training on 'self-care' prevents burn out. Training program allows employees to acquire new skills, sharpen existing ones, perform better and increase productivity. Through training program you know your strengths and weaknesses and how to manage them in the work place. It creates more harmonious environment.

About Training: Considering the above objectives, ADHAR (Badlapur) arranged a training program for female staff (45-55 age) once a week during their working hours from 5th May to 7th June 2021 on Menopause and it's management.



It was attended by nearly 27 female staff including social worker, teachers and care takers through audio visual and discussion mode.

The main objective of this training program was to:

- 1. Breakdown certain evil myths about menstrual cycles.
- 2. Awareness about physical, mental and emotional changes that occur during this period.
- 3. How to identify and manage this phase?
- 4. Self-Care.

Observation: During the session, there was openness & curiosity about the subject. It was satisfying to see them accepting the facts. There was readiness to share their stories and experiences and willingness to reach



the core depth of the topic.

Their feedback and enthusiasm has motivated me to conduct such more awareness sessions. There was a great connection between the thoughts, emotions and mental capabilities. It was a great experience for me and attendees.

Conclusion: After the awareness program, it was satisfying to see the caretakers in a better understanding of the taboo topic, which in turn will definitely bring a positivity in their approach while dealing with the children of ADHAR. This will not only give a stability of emotion to the staff but also help in providing a pleasant & supportive environment to our children who are bound to be more comfortable in the company of the staff member throughout.
